

Rocky Mountain Water **2017 Submission Guidelines**

Rocky Mountain Water (RMW) is the member publication of the Rocky Mountain Section of the American Water Works Association and the Rocky Mountain Water Environment Association. *RMW's* editorial purpose is to provide information and material related to the water and wastewater industry for the Rocky Mountain region.

Articles: Feature articles should resemble a magazine feature rather than an academic paper. It should be of interest to the general audience, informational, and free from any promotional language. Specific product information should be made generic unless its inclusion is essential for the reader's understanding. **Article length should be between 700 to 900 words.** Longer articles will be edited or may be published as a multi-part series. Unsolicited articles deemed to be acceptable may be published at the discretion of the Editor and on a space-available basis. Articles must be submitted electronically (via e-mail) in Microsoft Word format. Submissions must include:

- A headline,
- Author by-line,
- A short author biography,
- Author photo and the telephone number/e-mail address of the corresponding author.
- If pictures are submitted, they must be high res (1 MB or larger) and provided with captions and credit lines.

Footnotes are not used and any references, which should be kept to a minimum, should be attributed within the text of the article. All submissions should be emailed to lehigh61@msn.com by the submission deadlines listed below.

Graphics: Original graphic files (photos, figures, tables, charts) must be sent separately from text files. Photos and figures should be in TIFF or JPEG format, at least 300 dpi at a minimum size of 3×5 inches. Tables must be in Microsoft Word or Excel format.
